Course Description

The Symposium is divided into six main tracks: Preparedness, Response & Recovery, Individual Response, Special Populations, Disaster & Emergency Management and Special Trainings. Selection of a specific track is not required. However, pre-registration into courses is required for scheduling purposes.

Objectives

At the conclusion of the symposium, participants will be able to:

1. Identify the role of cultural, social and behavioral factors in determining the delivery of public health services, relevant to disaster behavioral health.
2. Collaborate with community partners to promote the health of the population, relevant to disaster behavioral health.
3. Identify and retrieve current relevant scientific evidence, relevant to disaster behavioral health.
4. Help create key values and shared vision and use these principles to guide action, relevant to disaster behavioral health.
