

Objectives

At the conclusion of the seminar, participants will be able to:

1. Name new initiatives implemented by the Centers for Disease Control to assist in controlling TB.
2. Describe the interaction between TNF-alpha blocking agents and TB infection and disease.
3. Discuss screening and treatment recommendations to prevent and control TB in patients undergoing treatment with TNF-alpha blocking agents.
4. Identify appropriate uses of the state Isolation and Quarantine statutes for TB patients and contacts.
5. Define the use and process of cohort reviews to assure quality care for TB patients.
6. Discuss best practices for managing TB patients with varied levels of drug resistance.
